

Mostly folded letter sheets, in pen and ink, on official and plain stationery, e.g., <i>Allegheny Arsenal, Pittsburgh, Pa.</i> and <i>Headquarters, Department of Dakota, St. Paul, Minn.</i> Michaelis, born in Germany, was the first non-West Point graduate to serve in the ordinance corps. He spent most of his adult life serving in many U.S. arsenals across the country. He first served at Gettysburg, and later acted as Gen. Thomas' chief ordinance officer at Nashville against Hood's disastrous attack. While serving as the seventh cavalry chief of ordinance, Major Michaelis identified the bodies of his close friend, George Armstrong Custer , and other soldiers, 2 days after the battle of the Little Bighorn. His letter to his wife about the battle was sold at Christie's in 2017. He was a noted chess player. Wilhelm Steinitz, the first official world champion, regretted his passing in 1890, calling him one of America's best amateur players. Included are telegrams and letters of condolence, one signed by James G. Blaine. A fascinating collection. (est. \$300-450)
